Dress Code

Students are encouraged to dress in comfortable clothes which are suitable and appropriate for the classroom.

Clothing which causes offence under our equality policies is not acceptable.

For example:

- Tops with offensive words or pictures.
- Clothing which causes offence to cultural or religious beliefs because it is too revealing.
- Articles of clothing associated with special groups are not permitted, e.g. football scarves.

- On formal occasions school uniform is specifically requested. This includes appearance in orchestras, choirs, visits and class photographs.
- Physical Education Kit - Shorts, T-shirt, socks and gym shoes, swimming costume and other sportswear as required. Please note that gym shoes or trainers used in the Games Hall must not be worn outside and must have a white, non-marking sole.
- Students are not allowed to wear any jewellery that is a danger to health or safety. Teaching staff will make a judgement on this. Students may not be able to participate in Physical Education if they are wearing jewellery that is a hazard to safety and it cannot be removed
- School sweatshirts are available on request.

Students should be conscious of the fact that their clothes should not be distracting or restrictive. Outdoor clothing should not be worn in the classroom.
